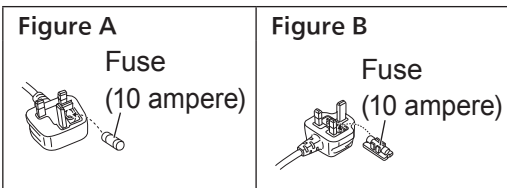
How to replace the fuse

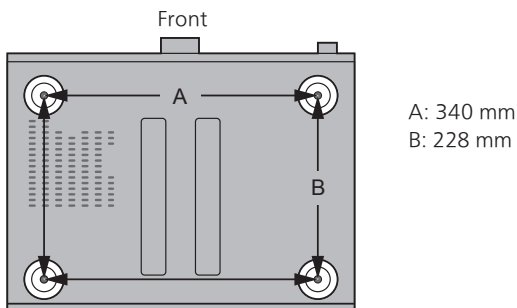

Installation

Installation

- Turn this unit off, fold the antenna and disconnect all the equipment before moving this unit. Be sure to raise this unit when moving, and do not drag this unit.
- Confirm the installation location can sustain the weight of this unit. (⇒ 128)
- For the dimensions of this unit (⇒ 128)
- Refer to the following figure for the dimensions of this unit's legs.



Unit care

Pull out the AC mains lead from the socket before maintenance. Clean this unit with a soft cloth.

- When dirt is heavy, wring a wet cloth tightly to wipe the dirt, and then wipe it with a soft cloth.
- Do not use solvents including benzene, thinner, alcohol, kitchen detergent, chemical wiper, etc. Doing so may cause the exterior case to be deformed or the coating to come off.

Remote control mode

When other equipment responds to the supplied remote control, change the remote control mode.

- The factory default is "Mode 1".

1 Press [SETUP].

2 Press [\blacktriangle], [\blacktriangledown] to select "Remote Control" and then press [OK].

- The current remote control mode of this unit is displayed.

3 When "Set Mode 1/2" is displayed, change the remote control mode of the remote control.

To set "Mode 1":

Press and hold [OK] and [1] for at least 4 seconds.

To set "Mode 2":

Press and hold [OK] and [2] for at least 4 seconds.

4 Point the remote control at this unit, and press and hold [OK] for at least 4 seconds.

- When the remote control mode is changed, the new mode will appear on the display for a few seconds.

■ **When “Remote 1” or “Remote 2” is displayed**

When “Remote 1” or “Remote 2” is displayed, the remote control modes of this unit and remote control are different. Perform step 3 above.

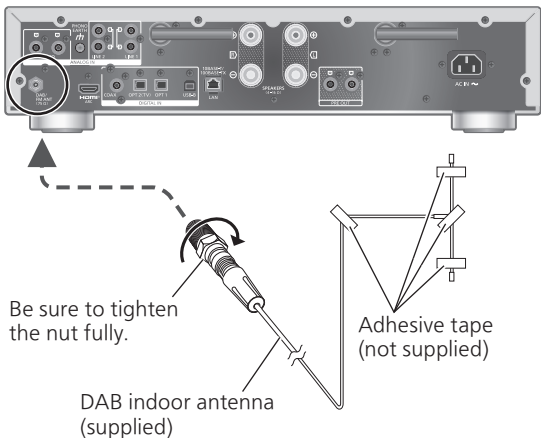
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Antenna

- This unit can receive DAB+ and FM stations with the DAB antenna.

Antenna connection



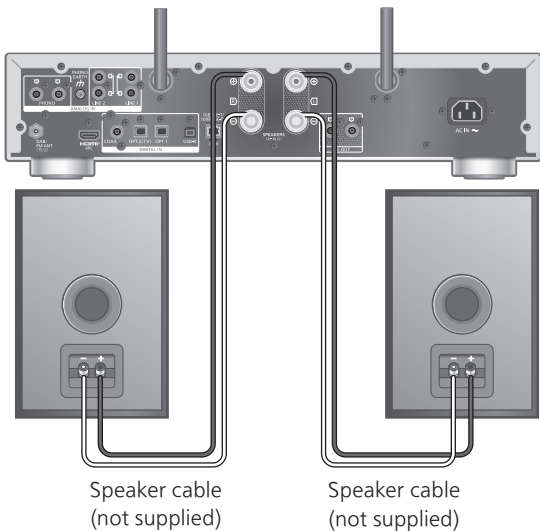
- Tape the antenna to a wall or column at the position with the least amount of interference.
- If radio reception is poor, use a DAB outdoor antenna (not supplied).

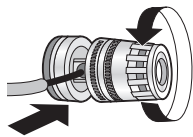
- The interference may occur if any electronic devices are nearby.

1 Turn the knobs to loosen them, and insert the core wires into the holes.



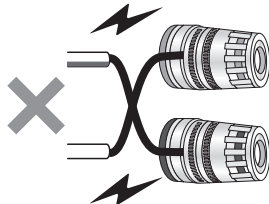
2 Tighten the knobs.

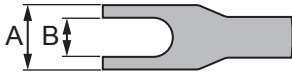
- Make sure to connect the speakers before AC mains lead is connected.
- When the connections are completed, pull the speaker cables lightly to check that they are connected firmly.
- Be careful not to cross (short-circuit) or reverse the polarity of the speaker wires as doing so may damage the amplifier.

DO NOT



- Wire the polarity (+/-) of the terminals correctly. Not doing so may adversely affect stereo effects or cause malfunction.

- Though the spade plug (A: 16 mm or less, B: 8 mm or more) can be connected, some plug may not be connected depending on the shape of plug.

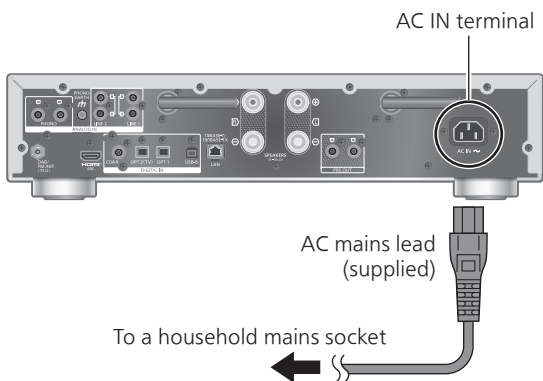

AC mains lead

AC mains lead connection

Connect only after all other connections are completed.



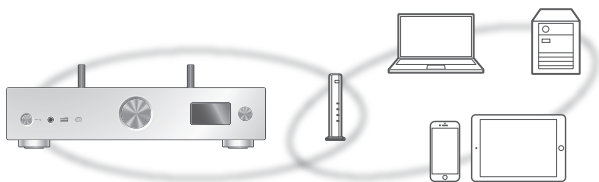
- Use only the supplied AC mains lead.
- Do not connect the AC mains lead until all other connections are complete.
- Insert the plugs of the cables to be connected all the way in.
- Do not bend cables at sharp angles.
- Wireless LAN (Wi-Fi®) setting may start when this unit is turned on. To stop the Wi-Fi setting, select "No" in "Wi-Fi Setup" screen. Select "Yes" to keep the Wi-Fi setting. (⇒ 31)

Note

- This unit consumes a small amount of AC power (⇒ 128) even when the unit is in standby mode. Remove the plug from the main electrical outlet if you will not be using the unit for an extended period of time. Place the unit so the plug can be easily removed.
- Set "Wi-Fi Menu" to "Off" to shorten the start-up time of this unit if you will not use the Wi-Fi function. (⇒ 100)

Network settings

You can stream online music services or music files from your smartphone/tablet to this unit. To use these features, this system must join the same internet-connected network as the compatible device.



This unit can be connected to a router using a LAN cable or built-in Wi-Fi®.

For a stable connection to the network, a wired LAN connection is recommended.

- If you try to change the network settings immediately after turning on this unit, it may take some time until the network setup screen is displayed.
- If “Firmware update is available” is displayed after the network connection is set up, the new firmware update for this unit is available.

- In order to fully enjoy all the features the SU-GX70 has to offer, it has been designed to work with the Google Home app which integrates with your Google Account.
- To provide the higher quality sound, select “On (Custom)” of “Pure Amplification” from the setup menu and set “HDMI” to “Disabled” to disable the HDMI function. (⇒ 64)

■ Preparation

If you install the Google Home app or Apple Home app on your smartphone/tablet, you can set up a connection using the application.

- When using Chromecast-enabled apps to play music on this unit, set up a connection using the Google Home app and a Google Assistant-enabled device.
- When using AirPlay to play music on this unit, add the product to Home in the Apple Home app. Adding this unit to the network via Apple Home app will also allow the user to stream audio using Siri.
- Make sure that the Wi-Fi function and Bluetooth® function are activated on your smartphones/tablet.

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Troubleshooting

Before requesting service, make the following checks. If you are uncertain about some of the check points, or if the solutions indicated in the following guide do not resolve the issue, then consult your dealer for instructions.

Heat buildup of this unit

This unit becomes warm while in use.

- Be careful when touching the bottom of this unit because the bottom of this unit may be hot. For installation or unit care, disconnect the AC mains lead, wait for at least 3 minutes.

Do you have the latest firmware installed?

Panasonic is constantly improving the unit's firmware to ensure that our customers are enjoying the latest technology. (⇒ 101)

To restore all the settings to the factory defaults

When the following situations occur, reset the memory:

- There is no response when buttons are pressed.
- You want to clear and reset the memory contents.

1 Press [SETUP] while this unit is turned on.

2 Press [▲], [▼] repeatedly to select "Initialization" and then press [OK].

3 Press [▲], [▼] to select "Yes" and then press [OK].

- A confirmation screen appears. Select "Yes" in the following steps to restore all the settings to defaults.

4 Press [▲], [▼] to select "Yes" and then press [OK] again.

General

The unit does not work.

Operations are not done properly.

- One of the unit's safety devices, etc. may have been activated.
 - ① Press [⏻/⏻] on the unit to switch the unit to standby.
 - If the unit does not switch to standby, press [⏻/⏻] on the unit for at least 5 seconds. The unit is forcibly switched to standby. Alternatively, disconnect the AC mains lead, wait for at least 3 minutes, then reconnect it.
 - ② Press [⏻/⏻] on the unit to switch on. (It may take some time for this unit to be turned on.)

A "humming" sound can be heard during playback.

- A strong magnetic field near a TV or other device may adversely affect the audio quality. Keep this unit away from such a location.
- The speakers may output noise when a device nearby is emitting powerful radio waves, such as when a mobile phone is on a call.

No sound.

- Check to see if the cable connections to the input and output terminals are incorrect. If this is the case, turn this unit to standby and reconnect the cables correctly.
- Check to see if the correct input source is selected.
- Insert the plugs of the cables to be connected all the way in.
- Confirm the sound output setting. (Sound is not output from the speakers connected to the speaker output terminals of this unit while "PRE OUT" is set to "On (Speaker: Off)".) (⇒ 110)
- Sound is not output from PRE OUT terminals while "PRE OUT" is set to "Off". (The factory default is "Off".) (⇒ 110)
- When a plug is connected, the speakers and PRE OUT terminals do not output sound. (⇒ 109)
- Playback of multi-channel content is not supported.
- The digital audio input terminal of this unit can only detect linear PCM signals. For details, refer to the operating instructions of the device.

Playback does not start.

- Depending on your environment or connected devices, it may take some time.
- Playback of multi-channel content is not supported.
- Check to see if the format of the file is supported. For supported formats, refer to "Format". (⇒ 131)

The unit turns to standby mode automatically.

- Is the auto off function turned on? (⇒ 98)
- When using HDMI CEC (Consumer Electronics Control) function, this unit may turn to standby mode according to the connected HDMI equipment. (⇒ 58)

Power indicator turns off.

- The unit is off.
- The power indicator turns off by pressing [DIMMER] repeatedly when "DIMMER Steps" is set to "5 (including Blackout)". (⇒ 99)

The settings are reset to the factory defaults.

- Updating the firmware may reset the settings.

Radio

DAB+ reception is poor.

- Keep the antenna away from computers, televisions, other cables and cords.
- Use an outdoor antenna (⇒ 24).

Static or noisy reception is heard while listening to a radio broadcast.

- Confirm the antenna is properly connected. (⇒ 24)
- Adjust the position of the antenna.
- Keep a certain amount of distance between the antenna and AC mains lead.
- Use an outdoor antenna if there are buildings or mountains nearby. (⇒ 24)
- Turn off the TV or other audio players or separate it from this unit.
- Keep this unit away from mobile phones if there is interference.

USB

The USB drive or its contents cannot be read.

- The USB drive format or its contents is/are not compatible with the unit. (⇒ 123)
- The USB drive may not be read which has the files/folders with the long names, even if the number of the files/folders of the USB device doesn't reach a maximum number (⇒ 130).
- The USB connection is not available when "Pure Amplification" is set to "On" or "Network/USB-A/Bluetooth" is set to "Disabled". Set "Pure Amplification" to "Off". (⇒ 64)

No response when [▶/III] is pressed.

- Disconnect the USB device and then reconnect it. Alternatively, turn the unit to standby and on again.

Slow operation of the USB flash drive.

- Large file size or high memory USB flash drive takes longer time to read.
- It may take some time if there are a lot of files or folders on it.

Cannot display the information properly.

- Track names, etc. may not be displayed properly.

HDMI

HDMI CEC function does not work.

- Check the HDMI CEC setting of the connected equipment. (Enabling the HDMI CEC setting of the connected equipment, selecting this unit as an audio output, etc.)
- Read the operating instructions for the HDMI equipment (TV, etc.) for details.
Reconnection of the equipment, blackout, plugging and unplugging AC cord may be a cause of problem. Perform the procedure below.
 - ① Turn TV off and on while all equipment connected with HDMI cables is turned on.
 - ② Set HDMI CEC setting of TV to off and on.
- The HDMI connection is not available when "Pure Amplification" is set to "On" or "HDMI" is set to "Disabled". Set "Pure Amplification" to "Off". (⇒ 64)

Bluetooth®

Pairing cannot be completed.

- Check the Bluetooth® device condition.
- The Bluetooth connection is not available when “Pure Amplification” is set to “On” or “Network/USB-A/Bluetooth” is set to “Disabled”. Set “Pure Amplification” to “Off”. (⇒ 64)

The device cannot be connected.

- The pairing of the device was unsuccessful or the registration has been replaced. Try re-pairing the device. (⇒ 48)
- This unit might be connected to a different device. Disconnect the other device and try re-pairing the device.

The device is connected, but audio cannot be heard through this unit.

- For some built-in Bluetooth® devices, you have to set the audio output to this unit manually. Read the operating instructions for the device for details.

The sound is interrupted.

- The device is out of the 10 m communication range. Bring the Bluetooth® device closer to this system.
- Remove any obstacle between this system and the device.
- Other devices that use the 2.4 GHz frequency band (wireless router, microwaves, cordless phones, etc.) are interfering. Bring the Bluetooth® device closer to this system and distance it from the other devices.
- Select “Mode1” for stable communication. (⇒ 50)

Network

Cannot connect to the network.

- Confirm the network connection and settings. (⇒ 28)
- If the network is set to be invisible, make the network visible while you set up the network for this unit or make a wired LAN connection.
- This system's Wi-Fi security supports WPA2™. Your wireless router must therefore be WPA2™ compatible. For details on the security supported by your router and how to change the settings, please refer to the operating instructions or contact your internet service provider.
- Make sure that the multicast function on the wireless router is enabled.
- Depending on the router, WPS button may not work. Try another connection method. (⇒ 32)
- The wireless LAN environment or radio interference in your area may cause connection problem. In this case, try another connection method. If the problem persists, make a wired LAN connection. (⇒ 30)
- While the AC mains lead is disconnected, the LAN cable must be connected or disconnected.
- The network function is not available when "Pure Amplification" is set to "On" or "Network/USB-A/Bluetooth" is set to "Disabled". Set "Pure Amplification" to "Off". (⇒ 64)

Cannot select this system as the output speakers.

- Make sure that the devices are connected to the same network as this unit.
- Reconnect the devices to the network.
- Turn the wireless router off and then on.
- Turn this unit to standby and on, and then select this system as the output speakers again.

Cannot select this unit from the Chromecast-enabled apps.

- When using the Chromecast-enabled apps to play music on this unit, you need to set up a network connection using Google Home app. (⇒ 34)
- You may not select this unit from the video apps, etc.

Playback does not start.

The sound is interrupted.

- The content may not be played back properly depending on the network condition.
- If using the 2.4 GHz band on the wireless router, simultaneous use with other 2.4 GHz devices, such as microwaves, cordless telephones, etc., may result in connection interruptions. Increase the distance between this unit and these devices.
 - If your wireless router supports 5 GHz band, try using the 5 GHz band.

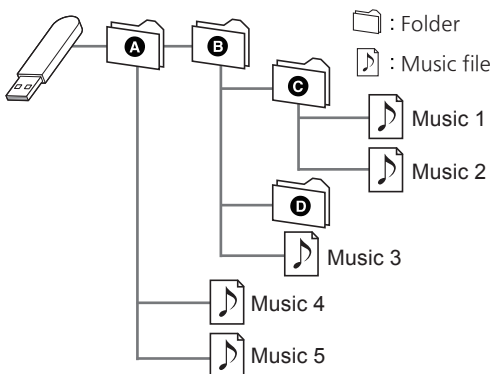
